Aspects of School Security & Safety PREVENTION-RESPONSE-RECOVERY

- Physical Security
 - Building Design
 - All Hazards Assessments
 - Access Control & Fencing
 - Surveillance
 - Visitor Management

- Mental/Emotional Security
 - School Climate & Culture
 - Training
 - Emergency Drills
 - Harassment/Bullying/Intimidation
 - Anonymous Tipline

Physical Security

- All buildings have completed comprehensive, all-hazards site assessments (and working on recommended changes) – using CPTED Principles
- Single point of entry (main entrance) at all buildings
- Electronic surveillance systems at all buildings
- EHS, MMS have Visitor Management Systems in place, other schools soon
- Fencing projects at Valley View, Lincoln, Morgan, and EHS. Upgrades and additional fencing part of future site recommendations
- All buildings have an on-site Crisis Response Team
- Select staff have been trained in Threat Assessment, and formal TA conducted periodically

Mental/Emotional Security

Before a child can learn they need to feel safe

- Ongoing training and presentations to **students** including:
 - Harassment/Bullying/Intimidation
 - Cyber safety
 - Cell Phone Safety
 - Emergency Response (evacuation, lockdown, run/hide/fight, etc.)
- Ongoing training provided to various **staff** including:
 - CPR/First Aid
 - Crisis Management/Verbal De-Escalation
 - Drug/Alcohol Recognition
 - Emergency Response (evacuation, lockdown, run/hide/fight, etc.)

Mental/Emotional Security (cont.)

- All sites conduct monthly emergency response drills including Evacuation, Shelter in Place, Lockdown, Secure & Teach, and others
- All sites have common response plans and training
- Students at MMS and EHS have access to Anonymous Tipline for reporting dangerous, unsafe behaviors

Family Reunification

- Plan in place to reunify students with families in case a building is not able to be occupied
- Location for reunification will be announced via social media, Blackboard, website, radio stations
- Parent/Guardian must bring photo ID to pick up child
- Pick up by alpha/last name

Law Enforcement Partnership

- We benefit from an excellent partnership with Ellensburg Police Department
- 1 full time SRO School Resource Officer
- Part time Reserve Police Officers periodically in schools
- We encourage other officers/agencies to stop by anytime and tour our schools while in uniform

What can YOU do?

- Ensure your contact information is current at your child's school
- Talk to your kids about school safety (drills, plans, etc.)
- Encourage them to talk to you about concerning behaviors at school, share with school officials
- Volunteer at your child's school
- Report any suspicious or concerning behaviors to school or law enforcement
- Periodically check your child's phone and social media presence
